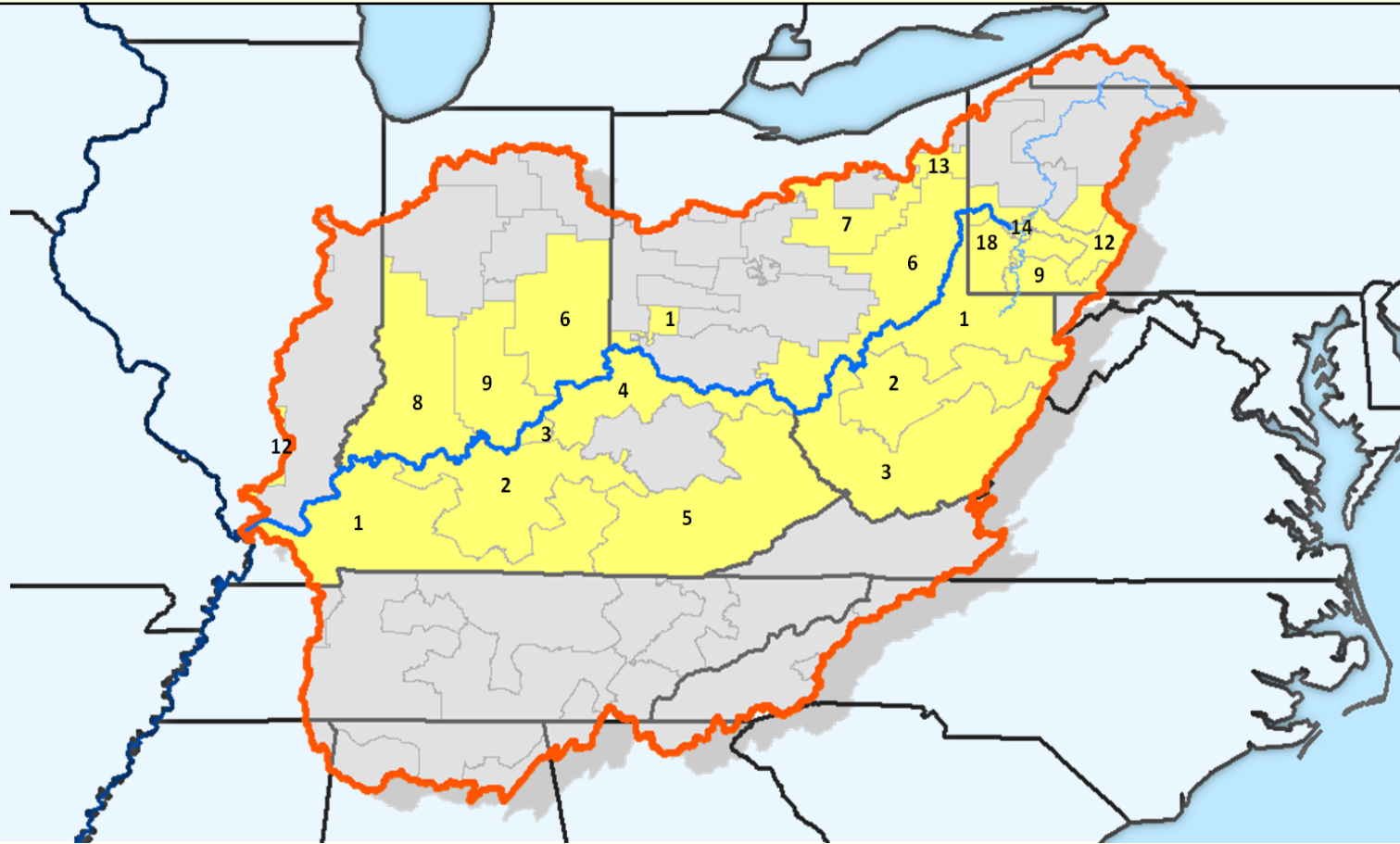


Ohio River Basin Congressional Caucus



The bipartisan Ohio River Basin Congressional Caucus was formed in October of 2009 to address critical economic, infrastructure, agricultural, environmental, and community issues within the Ohio River Basin. The major goal of the Caucus is to ensure support from Congress and the Administration for programs and projects essential to the watershed. There are 28 Senate and 55 House seats in the Ohio River basin. Working together, Caucus members can ensure that appropriate federal support is provided to protect and improve the

wise use of the abundant resource found in the Ohio River basin.

The Ohio River Valley Water Sanitation Commission, ORSANCO, is an interstate water pollution control regulatory agency formed in 1948 by Ohio River basin states to improve and protect the water quality of the Ohio River. ORSANCO works with basin state and federal agencies and, as such, is a valuable resource and asset for the Ohio River Basin and the Congressional Caucus.
